## THE GORDON CASUALTIES IN THE PENINSULA

It is sometimes objected by a certain type of critic, who mistakes sub-acidity for a fine sense of proportion, that too much has been written about the Regiment of Gordon Highlanders. A great deal has, indeed, been written about the Regiment, as you will find set forth in the bibliography to my *Territorial Soldiering in the North-East of Scotland, 1759-1814*; but the real wonder is, not so much what has been written, as what has been repeated, and what a mass of valuable available material has been left unprinted.

A typical omission in point is supplied in the present undertaking, namely, the casualties, or rather some of them, sustained during the Peninsular War, 1808-1814. That this has not been done before is a matter of surprise, if for no other reason than that it is very nearly seventy years ago since immense popular interest was raised in the campaign by *The Romance of War*, the first and the best of the long series of military novels produced by James Grant. Grant's story, which starts in the spring of 1812, was preceded and has been followed by an enormous number of books on the whole campaign, varying from the narratives of private soldiers to the elaborate studies in strategy by generals, such as General Beatson's *With Wellington in the Pyrenees*, which devotes a whole volume of 331 pages to the operations of a few days, July 25-August 2, 1813; and from elaborate histories like those of Napier (1828-40), who actually fought in the campaign, and Oman in our day. The actual services of the Gordons themselves have been minutely described to the length of 93,000 words, much bigger than the average novel, by Lieut.-Colonel Greenhill Gardyne in *The Life of a Regiment* (i, 164-412); but even he, with all his learned enthusiasm, does not venture on a detailed account of the casualties.

There is a good deal of excuse for this, because it is really very difficult to arrive at definite figures. No two authorities agree, for the reason that exact figures were impossible to compile. Writers have gone

to different authorities. For example Lieut.-Colonel Greenhill Gardyne points out that there are no returns for Corunna (I, 196). The only name of the two (or three, as some say) Gordon privates killed in the battle occurs not in a Casualty Register, but in the Muster Master-General's rolls. The difficulty of dealing accurately with the work of the Gordons in the Peninsula may be gauged from the fact that regimental books were not kept. Thus when Major-General G. F. Walker inspected the regiment at Roncesvalles on October 15, 1813, he reported (W.O. 27; 122) that there were "no Description Book of officers, none of soldiers, no register of furloughs and no substitute for the Record Book left in England." In the Quarter Master's department there were "no clothing book signed, no accoutrement book, no register of arms, no ammunition account except copies of the return." So he got this Order entered in the books of the regiment on October 20, 1813:-

Major-General Walker, having in the course of his inspection found great reason to complain of the irregularity of the books of the regiment as well as those of the companies, he requests of the commanding officer frequently to examine both, to see that they are all kept and made out strictly according to the instructions in His Majesty's Regulations, p. 291, and following, as he must be held responsible for this being so.

He was greatly surprised to find many of the Companies' Books of the first necessity continually wanting: no day books, without which no satisfactory account can be made out or proved; no accoutrement or clothing books, no weekly mess book; the ledgers in general so defective that, although signed by the men from confidence in their officers, there appears but in very few either dates, quantities, or distinct prices to each article, or even periods to hospital, or other charges necessary to satisfy the men as to their justice; no register of characters and defaulters that can have any effect in the prevention of crimes. With respect to regimental books, an equal defalcation of some most necessary to the good order and discipline of the Regiment.

I cannot do better than illustrate the discrepancies by a comparative table showing the facts as set forth by Cannon's *Record* (1851); Gardyne's *Life of a Regiment* (1901); Norman's *Battle Honours* (1911); and the War Office material at the Public Record Office:-

With regard to the bloody battle of Maya, July 25, 39, 31, 1813, Lieut.-Colonel Greenhill-Gardyne says (i., 364) that "it is evidently difficult to make an exact return of the killed in action, as the dead had to be left to be buried by the French, and several corrections seem to have been made." In regard to the battle of Arroyos dos Molinos, Oct. 28, 1811, Captain C. B. Norman (*Battle Honours of the British Army*, 175) says:—"I have been unable to trace any record of the losses of the individual regiments [nine in number] except in the case of the 92nd." Captain Norman gives one Gordon casualty in Badajos (whether in 1811 or 1812 does not transpire), though no one else suggests that the regiment was there.

Even in official reports you may find curious discrepancies. Thus we get one man spelt in three different ways and credited with three different fates as follows:-

Andrew Scobbie, sent to 2nd Battalion, 1803 (W.O. 25; 1331).  
 Andrew Szobbie, died Oct. 18, 1812 (W.O. 25; 1331).  
 Andrew Scobbie, died Oct. 18, 1812 (W.O. 25; 2119).  
 Abdreu Sibbie, died of wounds, Nov. 18, 1812 (Gardyne, i., 314).

Sometimes one gets different particulars about what looks very much like the same man; thus:-

Michael Murray, Private, Dingwall, labourer, d. of w., Sept. 17, 1813 (W.O. 25; 2119, no. 52).  
 Michael Murray, Private, Longford, labourer, d. of w., Sept. 17, 1813 (W.O. 25; 2119, No. 53).

In one return a man will be given as "killed in action," while a later one will show him as having "rejoined."

The figures as worked out by the four chief authorities supply the following results:-

The following list is compiled from four different sources:-

- (1) W.O. 25; 2119, "Register of Casualties." This volume, from Dec. 25, 1809, to October 24, 1817, Nos. 1-117, does not give the names of wounded and no officers' names.
- (2) W.O. 25, 2665, is an index to W.O. 25; 2119, some of the returns of which are however missing.
- (3) W.O. 25; 1331, the Muster Master-General's returns contain a few names not included in the other two.
- (4) Greenhill-Gardyne's *Life of a Regiment* contains 18 names not in any of the official returns; these I present in brackets. To this book I am mainly indebted for the names of officers, corroborated to some extent by W.O. 25; 2882, and W.O. 17.

The service of the Gordons in the Peninsula was divided thus:-

- (1) 1808, August 21-1809, January 18.
- (2) 1810, October 8-1814, July 17.

The casualties during this period amount to 483 men:-

In the matter of the prisoners I exclude 79 names which appear in the Muster Master-General's Returns (W.O. 25; 1331) under date May 25, 1809. When and where they were captured does not transpire. Some had probably been taken in Spain, but others may have been taken in Holland in 1799.
